


Marshfield Area Growing Together Community Gardens

In 2008, Marshfield Clinic and Healthy Lifestyles/Marshfield Area Coalition established 80 garden beds at three community garden sites whose mission is:

- Provide a place for Marshfield area residents to garden
- Support local food production
- Provide garden education to youth, adults, and families

Garden sites are supported by UW-Extension Wood County Master Gardeners through Master Gardener educational and grant support and are managed by a group of local citizens dedicated to community supported gardening opportunities. Garden sites are located:



Getting Started

- A 4x8 foot plot is available for a yearly fee of \$20.
- Anyone of any level of gardening expertise, from novice to experienced, is welcome. Orientation and training sessions are offered to facilitate success.
- The Square Foot Gardening method is encouraged
- Organic principles are followed. Chemicals are not allowed. Integrated Pest Management is used to control diseases and insects.
- Garden refuge is composted on site.
- Gardeners provide their own seeds/plants and harvest their own produce. Extra produce may be given to local food pantries.
